#### 2017 Bracero History Summit

This September, the **Bracero History Summit** will attract 200 people in the business of saving our nation's history. 2017 marks the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the 1942 U.S. Bracero Program executive order and the first group of Mexican braceros that entered the U.S. through El Paso, Texas to work in the sugar beet harvest in Stockton, California. Though the binational guest worker program ended decades ago, this program represents an important milestone in immigration history. Millions of Mexican-Americans can trace their roots to their fathers' or grandfathers' entry into the U.S. as braceros.
